Dear Resident Families,

I hope this letter finds you and your loved ones well.

The state department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has notified us the last admission will be on June 30th, after which Beaumont at Worcester will be decommissioned as a COVID-19 recovery center—probably on or about July 15th.

We have informed MA HHS that, following the July conversion, we will not again revert to a COVID-19 treatment and recovery center, regardless of what the future may hold.

While there are few specifics to share at this time, I wanted to give families notice of our plan to welcome Residents back to Beaumont at Worcester who were displaced at the beginning of the pandemic. We can report the building will be emptied and thoroughly disinfected, including with electrostatic foggers, prior to their arrival, as our diligence on infection control continues.

We are open to having all former Beaumont at Worcester Residents return who wish to do so, mindful the choice is theirs to make. For those who are comfortable with their current arrangements, there is no obligation to move back. There may therefore be room for others.

Please be assured we will make the return process orderly and respectful, unlike the emergency approach necessary months back. When more information is available, we will reach out directly to individual families to discuss your choices.
